Alister Yiap is currently in Singapore for his Exhibition 3 Rooms Object Design and the Body

3 ROOMS: Object Design and the Body is an exhibition that showcases the creative outcomes from a collaborative project involving curators, lecturers and students from Australia and Singapore. The project asked students from Curtin University, Perth, and LASALLE College of the Arts, Singapore, to consider fashion as a form of object design with reference to the body, rather than redesigning existing clothing made exclusively to be worn as garment. The project engaged contributors in inter-disciplinary research and practice to encourage new ways of designing and making fashion.

Using the body as a site a space for reflection, researching new materials and techniques for construction, engaging in new methods of investigation, and exploring cross-disciplinary approaches helped to move fashion away from its existing ties with garment, production and business to evolve new notions of what fashion is, and can be.

Please join us in welcoming 3 ROOMS co-curators Anne Farren and Emily Willis for a walk through the three galleries followed by refreshments. Key designers Elizabeth Deits and Alister Yiap will introduce participants to their creative practice and the works showcased in the exhibition.

General Business:

- Felicity Peters brought German book ordered by Willem Heyneker to be delivered by Julie-Ann.
- Felicity has had meeting with Byron Cornish regarding the sale of his tools and equipment. Jacquie Sprogoe and Jodie Lyndon-James to assist in sorting and pricing. Byron's daughter Susie to be included and involved. Sort in January and sale end January –first to JMGA Members, and then students from Curtin and TAFE. There is a bench, polished hammers, mandrel, metals, enamels, handtools, and also a heavy work bench. 10% of the sum raised to go to JMGA.
- Christel – suggested JMGA members may be interested in sending a group consignment of silver lemel to be refined. Over 2kg. has a refining rate of \$176 but better price paid for refined metal. Under 2kg. there is a flat gram rate.
